# Welcome to your Community Magazine

When asked to prepare a report for the AGM I considered what I had learned over the last year concerning the HRA. Prior to becoming a committee member for the HRA I hadn't realised just how much the HRA contributed to our community. I had read the magazine and attended public meetings, of course, but never a thought as to how the magazine materialized or how the contents were obtained. After a year as Chair, I now know. With little fuss, the HRA works to provide information and events for this small part of Essex, our home, as it were.

Despite the aftermath of Covid during the last year, we have held Garage sales, in which we had over 100 entries in 2022 and over 60 this year: a Poetry competition and of course, a "biggy" - the Village Fete. What a success that was, to be repeated this coming August. Funds were raised in order to purchase a defibrillator. In partnership with the "Lions" charitable organisation we managed to purchase a community defib. The Golden Fillet Fish and Chip Shop in Frinton Road has kindly offered to place the machine on their shop front as well as offering to contribute towards the ongoing maintenance of it.

A wildflower area is presently being created at Ipswich Road and a front garden competition is to be held in 2024. Keep an eye out in the Autumn issue of the magazine in order to prepare your garden in readiness.

In addition, we are researching the purchase of solar street lights for the 2023 Christmas festival. If successful,

we hope to make their turning on a very festive event.

The flag pole outside the Community Hall was situated so close to the existing tree, until recently, stopped the flag from being hoisted. The tree has now been lopped so it is hoped we can look forward to seeing it flying at the various celebrations.

At public meetings the HRA have done their best to provide speakers to deal with issues pertinent to local residents. At the same time, Councillors have done their best to answer your queries and to follow up concerns. By way of example, these have included abandoned vehicles along Holland's sea front and pot-holes, a seemingly never ending issue.

We are a small committee who, at monthly meetings, discuss topical issues and concerns relating to Holland. In addition, we try to anticipate those that are likely to present themselves in the future. All this, I may add, would be far more difficult without the aid of local and Essex councillors. It is our hope that any newly elected councillors, as well as supporting the HRA, will take the opportunity of contributing to our discussions.

Finally, I hope you will join with me in thanking the committee for their hard work and endeavours to help our community function agreeably. The HRA is just part of the bedrock that makes living in Holland such a positive experience.

# The Five Estuaries Wind Farm

Anyone looking out to sea at Holland cannot fail to notice the wind turbines. Lots of them. The nearest ones – and therefore the ones that appear largest – are the 48 turbines of the Gunfleet Wind Farm which started operating in 2010. It's about 7 km (4.3 miles) off the coast. Cables from each of the turbines run to a wine-glass shaped collector and from there to the shore. The export cable is not very wide – maybe 6 inches in diameter.

The cable from the Gunfleet Wind Farm comes ashore at Holland Haven. It actually runs up the beach between the Haven Café and Clacton Sailing Club although it is of course buried in a trench which is why you don't see it. From there it goes up the cliff, along the greensward to the radar tower and then to the electricity substation at Cooks Green. I only know this because I watched it being installed and if you told me about it now I don't know whether I would believe you because there is no evidence of its existence.

In addition to the Gunfleet Wind Farm you will sometimes see other turbines further away. To the left (when you look out from the shore) are windfarms off the Suffolk coast (Galloper and North Falls). It is an extension of these windfarms off

the Suffolk coast that will form the Five Estuaries development. Every household in Holland od Sea has received publicity material about this through the post and there are numerous public exhibitions around Tendring about it. Why is so much money being spent on something that is so far away?

The export cable from Galloper and North Falls goes ashore at Sizewell on the Suffolk coast where there is a nuclear power station. There are obviously transmission lines (pylons) that run from here to the National Grid infrastructure further inland. Now here's a funny thing. The export cable from the proposed Five Estuaries is not going to Sizewell. It's coming to Holland on Sea – or more precisely it's coming ashore between Holland Haven and Frinton.



The picture above is from the Five Estuaries website <a href="https://fiveestuaries.co.uk">https://fiveestuaries.co.uk</a> where the map is 'interactive' (you can zoom in or out) and therefore easier to read. The cable will go under the sea wall (horizontal drilling) and eventually be taken to a substation several miles inland. So a few years after the engineering works are completed there will be no evidence that it is there. Just like the cable from the Gunfleet Windfarm.

## **Tendring Specialist Stroke Services**

A stroke is a life changing experience and has a huge mental impact on confidence and people are often lost when they return home from hospital.

TSSS The Stroke Charity supports stroke survivors across North Essex

The charity delivers post stroke support, signposting and other services to those experiencing a stroke.

Services run at the therapy centre at Holland on Sea- Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 9.30am to 12 noon

A service is also run at Brightlingsea Football club on Monday afternoons.

On Wednesday afternoons a service for those experiencing a stroke runs in Dovercourt.

The service also contacts people in hospital, so they are aware of who they can speak to for advice.

The charity works closely with ESNEFT and is funded to deliver post stroke reviews and counselling.

The service offers exercise, post stroke rehab, friendship, counselling and support to carers. A support group is run every 1st Thursday of the month for carers to get together.

On Tuesday evening from 6.30pm a yoga group runs and is £5 per person, this is to improve the wellbeing and fitness of the community.

A community meal runs from 12.15 to 1.30pm on Wednesdays at a cost of £6 per person.

## **Surgery News**



Kennedy Way Medical Centre is pleased to say we continue to be on our way to recovery following the Covid pandemic. We were unable to provide Spirometry tests during the pandemic due to the nature of the procedure, however we no longer have any back log and are booking the tests within 2-3 weeks. The Surgery is providing comprehensive assessments for respiratory conditions and are now booking patients with Asthma and COPD to have their annual reviews face-to-face.

We are also pleased to report that the flu vaccine uptake increased this winter which meant far more vulnerable patients were protected. Kennedy Way will be offering flu vaccine appointments from September this year with booking available from early August.

The Surgery is looking to call patients with Long Term Conditions for their annual assessments during their month of birth. If you are struggling to get your annual appointment, please contact the surgery and ask for our Clinic Co-ordinator, Alana Mawby, who will be able to assist you.



# **Parliament Update**

Dear Holland-on-Sea residents.

It's been a busy month throughout April, as we planned for the Coronation of Their Majesties The King and The Queen, and Parliament returned from the Easter Recess.

Recess provided an excellent opportunity to get out and about in Clacton and hear from constituents about issues that matter to them, such as the Walton & Frinton Lifeboat Campaign and the need to keep our coasts – and our borders – safe.

We returned to Parliament after the Recess, and I set about using our first day back to ask the Secretary of State for Education about the provision of mental health services and training in schools. I was pleased to hear from the Secretary of State that a youth suicide prevention programme is in the works and set to be unveiled soon.

The Walton & Frinton Lifeboat Campaign has been one I have followed closely in the recent weeks and months. I am dismayed to hear of the plans by the RNLI to scrap our Tamar boat and replace it with a Rigid Inflatable Boat which I believe will not be as effective at enabling us to save lives at sea. For that reason, I have begun arranging meetings with the relevant Ministers to get us some answers, and ultimately hopefully stop this disastrous decision from reaching fruition.

The Coronation of Their Majesties The King and The Queen is an historic moment in our history as we gathered for the first time in seventy years to watch. I am honoured to have been invited to attend the Coronation as a representative of Clacton, to watch the passage of the Crown as Britain enters into this new Carolean age. I hope you found the ceremony as remarkable as I did.

As we watch crises unfold in Sudan and Ukraine, as well as in other regions, it is important as Parliamentarians to consider how this will affect the lives of our constituents. I am grateful to have been able to raise questions in the House of Commons this month about our continued support for Ukraine against Russian invasion, as well as the Government's plan for evacuating British nationals from Sudan.

The months ahead bring with them better weather, new opportunities, and renewed challenges to overcome. I am proud every day to be representing Clacton, the constituency I have called my home since 1957, in Westminster and beyond.
