Holland on Sea for Health and Sunshine

In 1931, according to the population census, the residents of Holland on Sea numbered 780, and the village came under the auspices of Tendring Rural District Council, having its own Parish Council. In that same year, the Holland on Sea Publicity Association published the first Official Guide, enriched with such slogans as "Maximum Sunshine...Champagne Air", "All Roads lead to Holland on Sea", and the alliteration "Holland on Sea for Happy, Healthy Holidays". This 28 page booklet introduced the reader thus:

Somewhere in the compartments of the mind of the city dweller there is cherished a picture of a quiet village in which some day, he hopes to find himself a member of the community.

A cosy cottage or bungalow, a neat garden and pleasant neighbours form part of the picture. The village has social amenities that are bright and agreeable - has a climate in which sunshine plays a predominant part - the sea near at hand - all reasonable transport facilities and, in its essential appointments, has a suggestion of progressiveness. Such are the things that compose the picture of the ideal which the average city man, grown weary of the hurlyburly of urban existence, carries in his mind. It is however, much easier to visualise such places than to find them. Nevertheless there is in England many villages that correspond to the ideal and if there is one that would appear to be more than ordinarily adapted to the purpose of providing for the city man a refuge for his days of retirement then the place is Holland on Sea.

So, the scene was set, and as the reader delves deeper they discover the delights on offer. The principle hotel in Holland was the Suffolk House which was situated on the corner of Holland Main Road, now Frinton Road, and what was to become Norman Road. The guide map enclosed still showed Kents Farm and Bennetts



William Collitt standing in the doorway of his chemist shop. He boasted "twenty-five years experience of seaside photography" in his advert. The building subsequently had the first storey removed and now forms part of "Masters & Misters".



On the left is A. G. White's Garage that undertook motors, cycles, and general repairs, as well as selling oil, tyres, and BP petrol. On the corner of Holland Main Road and Coronation Road (now Windermere Road) is the Orwell Dairy, with milk supplied by Bennetts Farm, and opposite is Arnold J. Carter – Estate Agent.

Farm, plus two roads that never came to fruition – Wansted Road and Leyton Road that were marked as cutting through from Kings Parade to Holland Main Road, east of Bournemouth Road. Auctioneer and Surveyor Arnold J. Carter, with his office on the corner of Kings Avenue and the Holland Main Road, was busy encouraging "speculators" to buy building land, with over 100 acres available on the East Cliff, High

Cliff, King's Cliff, Empire Cliff and Preston Park Estates; the freehold land being available by the acre or plot. Also available were seaside residences, boarding houses, furnished houses, business premises and hotels. Although a provisional license for the King's Cliff Hotel had been granted, the hotel itself was not yet fully completed and had to wait until the following year, 1932, before opening its doors to the public.

It was evident from the guide that it was aimed at a mix of attracting both visitors and those looking to reside in the village, whilst also hoping to appeal to possible developers. The many adverts were for a broad spectrum of services and facilities, ranging from Marguerites Cafe, offering hot and cold luncheons and fish suppers to Geo. Kennell & Sons - builders and contractors of York Road. The advert for F. W. Hazleton of Kings Avenue would have put Arkwright (Ronnie Barker) to shame, selling cigarettes and tobacco, hairdressing, photographic films (and developing), book lending library, a hire service for pushchairs, prams, cots, high chairs, deck chairs, sea horses, gramophones, tennis racquets, the sale of everything for the beach, bathing and seaside sports such as plimsoles and rubber bathing shoes; whilst G. Hazleton & Son, also of Kings Avenue, was the leading fruiterers, greengrocers, and newsagents, plus a fine assortment of seaside postcards, comics and birthday cards. And let us not forget our daily bread, with the Empire Loaf, available from Holland on Sea Bakery on the Main Road, next to St. Bartholomew's Church. The village was growing all the time and another advertiser in the guide was C. H. Chaston & Co building contractors with the telephone number 6y4. In 1931 work was underway on the Oueens Hall Cafe and shops, where Maplin Court now stands, in Kings Avenue; a 350 seat theatre being a slightly later addition which did not open until 1935. The guide concluded with a list of apartments and board residence, where the wording "Terms moderate" was commonly used.



Situated where the Tavern now is, on the left of the picture is Wayside Stores, whose proprietor was John S. Starling.



Rutland Post Office, on the corner of Kings Avenue and Preston Road, was a single storey building that later had a first floor added and subsequently became D. G. Pettit. You could buy Holland on Sea rock and local view postcards, as well as stationery. It is now the home of "Scizzor Sisters".

One will never know how successful that 1931 Holland on Sea guide was to attracting visitors, residents and developers but hopefully the compiler and editor -Noel C. Clarke was pleased with its sales, for there was a 4d (2p) charge for it. Things were certainly moving though as, in 1934, Holland on Sea transferred over from Tendring Rural District Council to Clacton Urban District Council and, at the same time, it lost its parish status. That same year the population of Holland on Sea had increased to some 1.500. Holland on Sea was to continue to grow over the coming decades but, one hopes, that it has never lost its charm as a unique village tucked away in North-East Essex.

## Tendring Talking Times

The current Chairman of the Charity which produces Tendring's Talking Newspaper, Hollis Drake retired at their 47th Annual General Meeting held this week after 14 years in the chair as well as being a Producer and Reader.

The Charity produces a weekly summary of local news primarily for people who are blind or visually impaired which is recorded onto Memory Sticks which are posted out to the listeners. Each listener is provided with a simple device on which the recordings can be played and once listened to the Memory Stick can be mailed back to the Charity at no cost to the listener using the same envelope as it arrived in.

Hollis Drake was thanked by everyone present for his service and hard work on behalf of the Newspaper and Hollis Drake in return wished his successor Adrian Robinson an enjoyable time in the Chair even if it may at times be challenging.

Recordings are created by the volunteers in

their own studio premises by rotating teams comprising of engineers, producer, editors and readers on a Thursday evening and other volunteers. The Charity is now very keen to hear of others who can give some time mainly on a Thursday afternoon to join these teams as some are quite short of people but despite these shortages there is a good spirit within the teams.

Adrian Robinson also stressed that the Charity is keen to learn of visually impaired persons in the Tendring area who do not already receive this weekly digest. There is no charge for this service which is largely funded by legacies. Unfortunately, during the pandemic the number of listeners dropped from 400 to a current 75 so the Charity feels there must be many more people out there who would enjoy using this service.

### **Surgery News**



COVID-19 has unsuspectedly enforced digital change across all areas of health and social care. It is now a contractual requirement for all GP practices to have a digital first solution. Digital First is a nationally funded, transformational programme of work with a focus on delivering equitable access to digital services, for all patients. Kennedy Way Medical Centre is undergoing planning to comply with the programme and therefore you will see some changes in the near future on how you can access the surgery. Please keep an eye on our Facebook page for any updates.

Flu season will be shortly upon us, Kennedy Way Medical Practice will be holding flu clinics from late September and appointments are available to book now. You will be eligible for a free flu vaccine if you are aged 65 year and over, under 65 years if you are in a clinical risk group, or pregnant. The surgery will also be vaccinating all children aged 2 or 3 years on 31st August 2023. We will be sending out links via text to eligible patients to allow self-booking online. Appointments can also be made via telephone or at the surgery.

#### **New Surgery Appointments System**

The Department of Health have decreed that patients should be able to contact their surgeries via on-line services. To that end the East Suffolk and North Essex Integrated Care Board (ICB) have decided to move all surgeries in their area to an APP based system in our case *askmyGP* powered by evergreen life. There are several APPs available but our surgery considered this to be the best option for us.

Some members of the Kennedy Way PPG (and others from Ranworth and Caradoc surgeries) attended a demonstration on 2nd August. There will be two ways of contacting the surgery, either patients can use the APP or they can phone, at any time of day, and the reception staff will enter details on their behalf. The APP can be accessed by smartphone, tablet or PC. Patients will be asked four or five simple questions and asked to give a brief description of their reason for making contact with the surgery. Whichever route they choose, the information will find its way onto the <code>askmyGP</code> system and will be triaged by a clinician at the surgery. Patients will then be contacted by the surgery with a hopefully same-day appointment or advice as to how to proceed.

We have some reservations having gone through the ACE era, but we are assured this is not a return to that system. Evergreen systems are now in place in many surgeries across



the country and we were told that in the surgeries in Suffolk that have already moved to this system 70% of the contacts now come on-line via the APP. As a result, it is far easier to get through on the phone and you can phone any time of day as triage will be on-going throughout the day. It was pointed out to us that many GP appointments are currently wasted by patients insisting on seeing a GP when they could be dealt with more effectively by specialist clinicians. An effective triage system will prevent this happening and thereby free up more GP time for those who actually need it.

Ranworth surgery will be the first to transform on 10th October 2023, followed by Kennedy Way on Tuesday 24th October. We understand that all surgeries within the ICB area will eventually use an APP based system.

All are welcome to attend. Nurses and experts will be on hand to support with any questions or issues with regards to the stroke condition.

Going forward The Stroke Charity will be having a Book Fair on Saturday 13th October and the Xmas Fayre is planned for 4th November, to get those Christmas gifts nice and early. The charity would like to thank local companies, individuals and volunteer groups for ongoing contributions and fundraising to help stroke survivors with the often-arduous and emotional journey to acceptance and gaining confidence to negotiate the world. Our team are a group of dedicated professionals with a wealth of experience. Our major work this year is to grow the awareness of the stroke condition and to work on community wellness and awareness, promoting prevention. October is World Stroke Day and we will have a series of events to ensure we improve the health and wellbeing of the community and those experiencing a stroke.

### **Your County Councillor**

In contrary to my report in the previous addition a lot has progressed and I have fewer words to tell you about it, so I'll try not to waste any.

The foot paths in York Road and Princes Road have been started as part of a yearlong campaign that will see a few of longer paths completely resurfaced. I was also able to negotiate with the contractor to resurface the very top of Norman Road (an unadopted road) at his cost in exchange for using part of York Road car park as a base.

The pothole scheme is back and I have already been supplied 18 sites of the worst potholes by the newly elected ward councillors. These should be done pretty quickly as the scheme is only just being rolled out. I have another 18 to come in December so if you are having a pot hole issue, let your ward councillors or me know.

Some worrying news. ECC is looking to put on-street car parking along the seafront. I am not in favour as it brings no extra benefit to residents and will only cause problems such as increased parking down side roads. What we currently have works well with demand only increased in the school holiday periods. Debates on social media seem mixed, but most recognise that if there are no benefits to residents then it should not go ahead. By the time you read this I will have met with ECC to discuss, and hopefully prevent, this idea. If you would like to discuss this with me then please get in touch.
