### Under Canvas in Little Holland

Camping came early to Clacton and Little Holland, long before any real thoughts of either place being a possible holiday destination. As part of the war against France, in the spring of 1795 a Major Hay, inspecting the local coast, wrote: "The communication at Clacton Wick might be disputed by a Redout". And it was at the lower end of this communication – namely Wash Lane – that earthworks were immediately put in hand to contain a gun battery. At the same time other batteries were commenced on the mound beyond Holland Gap, to command the sluice.

With the fear of a possible French invasion increasing, in May 1798 a large military camp was established along the cliffs at Great Clacton and Little Holland where up to 3,000 men from various regiments, militia and fencibles, were stationed on detachment from Colchester over a period of some years.

Remains of a cooking range which they used were found near York Road. Certain roads were reserved for military movement and various directives were issued for the evacuation of live and dead stock, the latter including at Great Clacton 100 gallons of spirits, 33 gallons of gin, and 100 barrels of beer. Up to three thousand troops were eventually encamped, in tents which extended westward beyond what later became Kings Avenue.

The climax came on 30 September 1801 when Prince Frederick, Duke of York, the Commander in Chief, visited the Clacton battery on his way from Colchester to Harwich, accompanied by the Marquess Cornwallis. The following day peace preliminaries were agreed with the enemy, and Cornwallis proceeded to France where he signed the treaty of Amiens, which brought a short respite to the war.

But a little while later, in May 1803, Britain

renewed the war against France, knowing that invasion threatened and in belief that the coast from Clacton northward was favourable for attack. The invasion scare was indeed at its height. Weeley was immediately selected as a centre for the defending troops, and extensive barracks were built there, but for some four years the large encampment was maintained along the cliffs at Little Holland. Do remember, all the above happened long before any thought

of turning the farming land that made-up Little Holland into any form of residential settlement.

There was, however, little joy to be had by the many soldiers camping along the coastal strip and after the real threat of hostilities ended then Little Holland was to return to a more peaceful way of life. One hundred years later, with Clacton establishing itself as a holiday destination, and Little Holland beginning to develop as a residential area, potential was seen for visitors to set up camp; one such site being near Hazlemere Road, and another up at Holland Haven.

Holland Brook and what is now Holland Haven Country Park. Back in the 1960s this would be home to a Boys Brigade camp, once the cows had been moved elsewhere.

An area of land that proved particularly popular for camping was between Primrose Road and Brighton Road, land that formed part of Bennetts Farm in York Road, owned by Henry Bridger of Little Clacton but farmed by the tenant Mr W. R. Sparrow. He designated an area for organised camps specifically focusing on groups such as the Boys Brigade and Scout packs. In the 1930s this form of holiday, reasonably priced and simple, appealed to many 'inland' organisations; allowing young people the opportunity for a week or two at the seaside, away from the built-up cities and more densely populated suburbia.

As Holland on Sea saw the growth of residential accommodation, and the formal ownership of both the greensward and Brighton Road open space going to Clacton Urban District Council, so the available 'rough and ready' camping sites disappeared. This didn't stop the Boys Brigade from pitching their tents, but just a little further away in the fields that now make-up Holland Country Park, and it wasn't uncommon to hear the bugle cry "come to the cook-house door boys" still wafting over the area in the 1960s.

### **Surgery News**

I last wrote a piece for the magazine back in January and a lot has happened since then.

We now have 11 GPs working across our Primary Care network (Kennedy Way, Green Elms and Ranworth). In addition, Dr Maria Parsons joined the team to manage the housebound and care home patients as well as carrying out some GP surgeries. We are now struggling for space and the idea previously floated of reconfiguring the rooms has proved prohibitively costly. We are therefore having to work with what we have.

The phones have now been upgraded (it only took BT a year). Patients will now be told where they are in the queue and can request a call back if they don't want to wait.

It seems to be helping.

ASKMYGP is now open daily until 5 pm. For the month of June Drs Shamshad and Qurban carried out all of the triaging to assess how the system was working. On most days we were told there were still appointments available. The other GPs will now be trained to operate the triaging system. Urgent requests should be lodged from 8 until 10. Non urgent cases will be dealt with after this time. If appointments are available that day they will be allocated. If not, an advance appointment will be offered. The long-term aim is for patients with on-going issues to be allocated appointments to the same GP each time (if possible).

In the autumn the surgery will be organising a men's clinic. Not sure of the details yet but it is likely to be in the evening. This has come about because although the surgery does run other clinics they are predominately for female issues.

We had a meeting with the prescription team and one of their requests was that if patients have queries they are most easily dealt with by email using Clacton.kennedyway@nhs.net, and heading it prescription query, it is also easier for them to deal with regular repeat prescriptions if they are sent electronically. The telephone prescription query line is still in operation (just press button 1). They will not necessarily be able to reply immediately but will get back within a day or two. If the query is urgent patients may visit reception to speak to a prescription clerk.



# **Your County Councillor**

### Should Holland-on-Sea Have Its Own Town or Parish Council?

You might have heard people talking about the idea of Holland-on-Sea getting its own town or parish council. It might sound like one of those dry political things – but actually, it's about something really important: how much say we have in what happens in the place we live.

I'm the one who put forward the idea of asking your views, so I wanted to take a moment to explain why – and what it might mean for you. Some of what I'll share is my opinion, and I'll make that clear, but most of this is based on facts about what's happening locally and across Essex.

To help make sense of this, I need to explain three changes that are all happening at the same time:

- 1. A big change called Devolution, which affects all of Essex.
- 2. Something called Local Government Reorganisation, which affects our local council (Tendring).
- 3. And finally, the idea of creating a town or parish council for our area that's the part we can influence most directly.

### 1. Devolution - A New Mayor for Essex

The Government has decided that Essex, will soon get a new regional Mayor – a bit like what Greater Manchester or London already has. This Mayor will take on some powers from Westminster, including responsibilities for things like economic development, transport and infrastructure, housing along with policing and fire services.

At first, the Government will cover the costs, but you will see a 'Mayoral' charge (called a precept) on your council tax bill in place of the current lines for the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner to fund the policing and fire services.

There was only one public event held about this – in Chelmsford – and most people across the county didn't have the chance to give their views.

2. Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) – Changes to the Councils Themselves This is a more complex change. At the moment, and including itself, Essex has 15 councils. The plan is to scrap them all and replace them with a small number of "unitary" councils that will be several times larger than Tendring's area/population. These new councils will be responsible for everything, rather than splitting tasks between district and county councils as we do now.

As an Essex County Councillor, I voted against LGR when it was first suggested, because I don't think it's right for our area – but I was in the minority. Now, like it or not, I have to help shape the best outcome for Tendring residents.

Different proposals are being developed. One version would merge Tendring, Colchester, Braintree and Uttlesford into one large council (four times the size of Tendring). Another option would group us with just Colchester and Braintree (three times the size of Tendring), probably putting the decision-making centre in Colchester.

That might not sound like a big deal now, but if all the key decisions are made further away, our area risks being further forgotten or deprioritised.

### 3. A Town or Parish Council for Our Area - What It Could Mean

This brings us to the idea of setting up a town or parish council just for our community. This would be our town or parish council, run by local people, with a small budget (called a precept) to spend on local priorities.

What might surprise you is that the rest of Tendring already has this. There are 27 town and parish councils in the district – including Harwich, Brightlingsea and Frinton & Walton. Most of these were set up in 1974, and not one has been removed since. That tells me that they must be doing something worthwhile.

In my opinion – and I'll be honest here – I think it's time that Holland-on-Sea, Clacton and Jaywick Sands had the same opportunity as other communities. Especially now, with Tendring District Council possibly being dismantled, having our own town or parish council would give us a stronger voice if the bigger decisions are being made somewhere like Colchester.

### Where We Are Now - A Public Consultation

Right now, there's a public consultation open. It's a very simple question: Do you think we should have a town or parish council in our area?

You can take part by:

- Filling in and returning the letter that may have come through your letterbox
- Or by going online and visiting:

www.tendringdc.gov.uk/consultations/community-governance-review

This consultation runs until 30th September 2025, and it's important to know that this is not a done deal. If most people say no, we won't go any further. My main goal was to give you the chance to decide, not to force a change.

But if most people say yes, then there will be a second consultation in November to ask what kind of council structure people would prefer. This consultation will be more technical to help draft a legal document to potentially bring into being:

- One council covering the whole area?
- Or separate ones for Holland-on-Sea, Jaywick Sands and Clacton?

You'll get the chance to answer that next, and you'll be able to change your mind between the two consultations if you wish.

#### What Will It Cost?

This is one of the biggest questions I've been asked – and it's a fair one. If we set up a town or parish council, there will be a small extra cost added to the council tax bill. But here's what that looks like in real terms for a Band D property as it currently stands compared to Clacton which has no council:

Area	Extra Cost (Precept)	Total Council Tax
Clacton	£0 (no local council)	£2,137.41
Harwich	£37.79	£2,169.98
Manningtree	£103.12	£2,198.86

Even though Manningtree adds over £100, their total bill is only about £61 higher than Clacton's. That's because when local councils take on jobs that the district council used to do, things are adjusted accordingly.

Across all 27 town and parish councils in Tendring, the average precept is about £75 per year.

### A few more points:

- Most town/parish councillors are unpaid. Some receive a small allowance, but it's rare.
- There are no expensive executives. These councils are often run by one or two staff members like a clerk or finance officer.
- Nearly all of the money raised is spent on local projects and services chosen by the community itself.

### In Summary

A lot is changing in Essex – from the introduction of a regional Mayor to the possible removal of our Tendring District Council. That's why I think now is the right time to talk about creating a town or parish council that gives you a stronger voice.

If there's support, we'll move on to the next step. If not, depending on the outcomes for Jaywick Sands and Clacton, the matter ends there. But at least we will have made the decision ourselves – not had it made for us.
