We have now extended the wildflower area and have sown next year's seeds. We were pleased with the display this year, having never tried anything like this before. Once the flowers had finished, we had to cut them back and then leave everything in situ to allow seeds to drop. We then had to rake away everything and hopefully we'll see more blooms next year.

We've continued to maintain the garden next to the former toilets. This does not need too much maintenance and continues to evolve. We've also worked on other areas towards the back of the wooded area. This includes removing a lot of dumped shrubs, twigs and branches which had accumulated over time. We've now planted over two hundred daffodils that should provide a striking display next spring. We've also added more bluebells to our bluebell area which was the only gardening disappointment we had as not many bloomed.

# Hotel Hospitality At Holland on Sea

Mention, to any resident of Holland on Sea, Hotels in the village and there will be a united cry of The Kingscliff, and rightly so; however, this was not the first hotel in our village.

At the end of the 1920's, two houses were built on the corner of Holland Main Road (now known as Frinton Road) and Norman Road, by Claude Chaston, and called Suffolk House and Norfolk House. They were subsequently linked by a curved sun lounge and became The Suffolk House Private Hotel, being advertised in the summer of 1929 as newly erected. Sitting in grounds with a frontage of 125 feet and a depth of 260 feet, the hotel comprised of nine large double bedrooms, two large single bedrooms, two bathrooms (no en-suite in those days), a dining room, oak panelled billiard room (which could be used as an extra dining room), sun lounge, two lower halls, cloak rooms, double kitchen and wash-up, plus larders, cupboards, WCs and other offices. Outside were the gardens which were laid out with three lawns, a small orchard, kitchen garden and large private car park. There were gravel drives around the garden, one of which led to the garage; this was detached and could accommodate four large cars and

offered an inspection pit, electric light, with water laid on and a large car wash down; the eaves of the garage provided good storage.

The hotel remained in the ownership of the Chaston family and was run by Mrs Chaston. In the 1931 Holland on Sea Guide there was a full page advert which boasted that it was on a "Special List AA Inspected Private Hotel" which, in some ways, could be read either way!! The advert claimed just three minutes from the sea, which certainly meant stepping it out, separate tables, and near the tennis courts. In 1931 the tennis courts referred to sat between Kings Parade and

Madeira Road, abutting York Road, where the Holland on Sea Bowls Club and car park now stand. For more information about The Suffolk House Hotel, and its tariff, you could telephone Clacton 4x6.

A good three-quarter year trade was carried out but, understandably, its peak occupancy was between June and September; Easter and Whitsun also proving very good business periods. By the 1950s the hotel industry had changed and the two properties making-up the hotel were separated and became residential occupancies, reverting to the names Suffolk House and Norman House respectively.

But going back to the 1930s and along the seafront, on the corner of Kings Parade and The Grove, originally known as Kaiser Grove and now called Queensway, was Holland's oldest seafront house named Highcliffe, built in 1903. In 1923 it was owned by a Mrs Butler, but by 1930 its owner was Mr Finnimore, and it was in the 1930s that it became The Highcliffe Private Hotel, owned and run by Mr and Mrs Ernest Phillips. The hotel sat in half an acre of ground, was listed

by both the AA and RAC and was proud to offer its own garden produce, hot and cold running water, separate tables (which seemed an important point to potential guests), midday dinner, cosy lounge, and garaging facilities. The phone number was Holland on Sea 2207, but by the 1950s, with the new owners, Mr and Mrs A Huntley, there was a new phone number – Holland on Sea 2178. As with the Suffolk House Hotel, the 1950s saw the decline in patronage and the building reverted to residential use; much of the garden, both fronting Kings Parade and to the rear, in Queensway, was sold for building plots, the spire roof on the front east corner was removed, and a dormer window placed in the roof. Also demolished was the attractive adjoining greenhouse.

It is pleasing that Suffolk House, Norfolk House, and Highcliffe are still standing, albeit in reduced grounds, and provide a timely reminder of what Holland on Sea had to offer visitors who wished to spend some time relaxing away from it all in our lovely village. **Richard O. Walker** 

# Surgery News



By the time you read this the new *askmygp* system will have been in operation for some four months. Most patients seemed to have been able to register without too much difficulty, however it has become a bit like marmite – you either love it or hate it. Some patients think it is brilliant whilst others consider they are worse off.

Contrary to what we were led to believe by "Evergreen", the company behind the software, the system is not available all day. Indeed, once capacity has been reached the system is shut down for clinical use; in practice this means usually within an hour or two of opening. Introducing this system has not increased the clinical capacity available daily at the surgery. However, the surgery is currently employing one locum virtually full time to cover maternity leave and two new GPs have recently joined the surgery in November. The staff that are there are trying their best to keep the surgery running. Please bear that in mind when contacting the surgery.

I have been in contact with another user surgery of a similar size to ours in Bury St Edmunds where they tell me that they are happy with *askmygp* and it is available all day. However, they have at least three if not four GPs working on a daily basis for some time.

It should be noted that those patients who are able and willing to use *askmygp* can input their request whenever the system is open and generally receive a response within about 30 minutes. Those who have to rely on the telephone can be at a disadvantage. Particularly as our situation has been made worse by the fact that the new telephone system which allows patients to be called back instead of hanging on or re-dialling is still not in operation. BT promised this before we went live and at the time of writing they still have not enabled it.

**Correction** - a couple of issues ago I said that you no longer needed to provide identification to receive a copy of blood test results. This should have read you will no longer have to fill in a form to receive blood test results but you will still have to prove your identity.







As I sat down to write my penultimate article, I realised I was saddened to be leaving Holland-on-Sea as your County Councillor. I thank all those who wished me well so far and explained why I will still stand as a County Councillor but, with the boundary change I will now be, as usual, standing in the area where I live which has always been Great Clacton.

That doesn't mean that I have stopped working for residents in Holland-on-Sea, far from it. Since my last article I have been out with all three district councillors representing Holland-on-Sea, attending their surgeries, registering potholes with them and tackling the pollarding of trees which seems to be a real issue all of a sudden. The councillors' surgeries are great and a real opportunity to raise issues with your councillors such as the Traffic Regulation Order that some residents discussed with us. These were being moved forward, but as usual ECC is a very slow beast.

I had the opportunity to pop into the library at the Holland Hall and has a good chat with the staff. I noted that it was very quiet. I remember the battle we had to keep the library and yet it seems we don't use it. A quick investigation showed that footfall is low and I wanted to take this opportunity to encourage people to use the library. The staff in the library are excellent and I will challenge every resident to visit it in the next three months to see what is on offer. I think you will be surprised!

It would be remiss of me not to mention the winter fuel allowance. The government has done what it has done, but I wanted to make sure that none of my residents are not missing out on the pension credit. There are several reasons why you might not be claiming it, but it is worth on average £3,900 a year or around £80 a week. I am happy to speak to and do a free check for any resident all in total confidence. My contact details can be found on page 43 of the magazine.

One last thing as I am running out of room. Every Essex Councillor receives a small amount of money called locality fund. I am hopeful that, along with the other seven County Councillors, to introduce Teentalk in Clacton which helps teenagers with life's issues. This has worked very well in Harwich and we are looking forward to it being expanded to this part of the world.

You will remember from my last report that I had asked our County Councillor, Mark Stephenson, to make enquiries as to when the pavements in Dulwich Road and Preston Road are likely to be resurfaced. Unfortunately there has not, as yet, been any positive news, but I will keep pressing for them to be done.

As you are all aware, I also deal with many issues involving the three Portfolios I am responsible for, Housing, Licensing and Planning, which involve weekly meetings with senior officers, a monthly meeting with Housing Team Managers on all things Housing and Homelessness, as well as meeting with Cabinet colleagues on a frequent basis, as well as other Committee meetings I am connected to.

I will also, by the time you read this, have attended the Annual Remembrance Sunday service at Clacton War Memorial, to remember all those who have died in the service of our country. It is something I feel very passionate about and it is heartening to see many of our younger residents come to also pay their respects.

I took a couple of weeks away from my desk in early November, this was due to taking our annual holiday in the sun, to relax and recharge the batteries, so my apologies if you tried to contact me in those weeks.


