Wreck and Rescue at Holland on Sea

There's nothing like a leisurely stroll along the seafront, the sea glistening and the waves gently lapping on the shore. However, it can be a very different picture when the wind freshens, and turns into a gale or, worse still, a storm. Whilst inland, the towns and villages might "batten down the hatches" and watch the wildly swaying trees, the inhabitants of Holland are also witness to the might of the sea, and turn their thoughts to anybody out there in boats, desperately trying to make for safe shelter.

With Holland on Sea situated in the mouth of the River Thames, there has always been a lot of nautical traffic heading into and out of London; the estuary being littered with sandbanks that shift about with some regularity.

At the turn of the last century there were some 2,000 barges registered, usually sailed by a man and a boy, that plied between, amongst other places, East Anglia and the capital, often taking building materials to the city. The barges known as "stackies" would have a regular run of hay and straw to the metropolis for the horse drawn transport, and returned laden with "what goes in must come out" to put back on the fields, so encouraging a healthy crop the following year. But whatever size the vessel, no captain wanted to be caught out in a storm, and once the safe waters of Harwich and the Backwaters were left behind, there was no protection until the River Colne and Blackwater

Of course, over four hundred years ago there was the Gunfleet Haven, a port that ships could and did trade to and from, its entrance being up where Holland Brook sluice gates now are. In 1504 there was reference to Gunflethayvn and the chronicler Holinshed wrote that Gunfleete was a port "such as our seafaring men do note for their benefit upon the coasts of England". However, by the 17th century the harbour

appears to have silted up, and the lower reaches of the brook were a morass.

So it was, from time to time, that ships and/or their cargo got washed up at Holland, some to be salvaged whilst others destroyed by the power of the sea. Of course, once any poor souls on board had been rescued, it was the opportunity to 'salvage' whatever folks could lay their hands on. Whilst all this was probably done out of ignorance, ships wrecked ashore actually became the property of the Crown, although a succession of ancient charters granted the right at Clacton to the lords of the manor; reverting back to the Crown at Holland was bad news for the Abbot of St. Osvth as he had to surrender to the Crown valuables washed ashore in his manor of Little Holland, In November 1873 wreckage was strewn for miles along the beach, and near Clacton Pier part of the decking drifted ashore with the body of the French captain lashed to a ring bolt; he was subsequently buried in St. John's churchyard, Great Clacton. On this occasion several people were summoned for pilfering the wreckage, including bibulous innkeeper of the Princess Helena, Little Holland, Fleetwood Codd; not the only time to find himself up against the magistrates, and Hannah Giles of Little Holland Hall whose children had wheeled some wood onto the lawn. This good lady, grandmother of the late Bob Giles of Sladburys, was fined with some reluctance by the magistrates.

Slightly more gruesome, a sailor's body was washed up on the beach in 1917, and in 1934 the barge "William Cleverly" ran aground at Holland Haven, and some twelve years later the barge "Lady Guinefred" also found itself ashore, again up at the haven.

At the beginning of the 1950s a small

vacht called the "Teal" was driven ashore, just below Sea Lane (the boundary with Clacton), having failed to securely anchor by Clacton Pier. Four young sailors jumped ashore but the boat was less fortunate and broke up very quickly. At the other end of the Holland boundary (with Frinton) in January 1966 a much larger boat was washed ashore when the "Mi Amigo", home of Radio Caroline, landed on the beach by Chevaux de fris Point. The ship had lost her anchor, four miles off Frinton Golf Club. and drifted inshore; it was evening and the crew on board were blissfully unaware as the Coastguard tried to call them up on the radio. Anglia Television even flashed up a message over its programmes but unfortunately the 'pirates' were watching the BBC! Such were the weather conditions. including driving snow, the Walton and Frinton Lifeboat was unable to launch and when the "Mi Amigo" grounded, the Walton Coast Lifesaving Corps fired a line across

the 470 ton ship and set up a breaches buoy, bringing ashore five disc jockeys, including Tony Blackburn and Dave Lee Travis, and some of the engineers and crew. The boat was re-floated a few days later.

Not so lucky were the owners of a small yacht that moored-up off Gunfleet Sailing Club in the summer of 1990. On a glorious sunny Saturday, the couple went for a meal that evening at the Kingscliff Hotel but when they returned to the deserted Club, and their yacht, a northeasterly storm had blown up. The boat broke its mooring and, in the pitch black, the owner swam out to the craft. When he got on board he realised he hadn't got the key to the locked companionway but managed to force the padlock off. Not being able to start the engine. the boat crashed into the solid breakwater at First Avenue, the casualty managed to jump ashore, and the next morning the wreckage was scattered all around.



We have had some lovely weather recently, and as I write this report, the sun is shining and it is a beautifully warm day. I do believe that summer is already here!

I continue to deal with resident's enquiries, issues across the Ward, reporting those where necessary, and also those that I have found while on a Ward walk, including the increase in fly tipping at Valley Road Recycling area, and also on occasion at Ipswich Road. As I have stated before if the clothing recycling bins are, or appear to be full, leaving items in bags in front of them will not be treated as recycling, but fly tipping, and will therefore end up in landfill, thus defeating the intention.

Myself, and Councillor Adrian Smith were out on Good Friday, in Valley Road, in response to resident's complaints of the pavement being impacted by overgrown bushes. Despite it being the responsibility of the County Council, who have stated, "We have closed this enquiry with no planned further action. If the location is on the public highway, we will continue to monitor it through routine inspections", to maintain this area, we took it upon ourselves to cut back where possible.

We held our first Councillor Surgery on 15th March, where we spoke to 7 residents, and have dealt with the issues raised; the details of the remaining three dates were in the previous magazine.

I attended the HRA AGM and gave an update on issues that will affect us as residents. By the time you will be reading this all Councillors across Clacton, Jaywick and Holland on Sea will have met to discuss the proposal around a Parish/Town Council. To be clear, NO decision has yet been taken, and I am committed to keep all residents updated, as best I can, around this subject. It was suggested that a public meeting could be arranged for discussion, and I have spoken to the relevant officer at TDC about attending any such meeting, to explain the process etc.

I did say in March's edition that the earth 'bund' on Eastcliff would be improved, together with a similar 'bund' going in at the Lyndhurst Road/Hazlemere Road open space as well. This has yet to happen but I am hoping for some progress in the near future.

I continue to deal with the many different issues involving the Portfolios I am responsible for, these being Housing and Planning, which involve at least weekly meetings with senior officers, a monthly meeting with Housing Team Managers, as well as meeting with Cabinet colleagues on a frequent basis, as well as other Committee meetings.
